SNOW IS FALLING!

Winter weather is here, we are trading out the lightweight hiking gear for more layers and skis and snowshoes to explore our backcountry. Fortunately, there are fewer of us heading out this time of year, allowing some regeneration of habitats and wildlife. Thank you to our many dedicated volunteers for the incredibly good work this 2023 season, including over 400 patrols and over 10,000 interactions with visitors, 41 sawyer outings clearing 513 trees, and llama work trip volunteers removing over 100 illegal fire rings, and clearing trees blocking trails in more remote camping areas. Our Wilderness would be suffering greatly without our work. Thank YOU!

Thank you to Jim Alexander for his continuous grant writing success for weed removal and trail work. This year we are hopeful to get started on a 10-year project called Wilderness Gateways to improve heavily used trails off I-70 starting with the Meadow Creek trail improvements that will prevent erosion due to a collapsed bridge and poorly designed trails.

ESWA has no paid staff, we are all volunteers. Please keep up your volunteerism, and consider something new next year. We are always seeking volunteers for more committee help year-round.

We have also been busy on many advocacy issues affecting our Wilderness and wildlife! Our wildlife migrate and move in and out of our Wilderness Areas all seasons. ESWA has been very supportive of several very critical wildlife protection projects:

Protecting Bighorn winter habitat has been an important ESWA priority this year! The sole remaining native herd of bighorn sheep in Eagle County may be the last truly native bighorn sheep herd in Colorado. The Town of Vail recognizes the importance of the parcel to local wildlife, and has tried for years to negotiate an exchange with Vail Resorts, offering numerous other parcels more suited for development as much-needed employee housing. ESWA's efforts, along with local groups', to persuade Vail Resorts to reverse course have been unsuccessful. In 2022, the Town

Council voted to protect this critical wildlife habitat through eminent domain, and won a favorable decision in district court. This critical habitat, threatened by Vail Resort's development plans is still in dramatic legal process.

ESWA has worked to support East Vail Pass Wildlife Crossings Project and Summit County's application for the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation RESTORE Colorado 2024 grant opportunity for the Wildlife Crossings Project, long identified as a priority due to the high traffic volumes, creating a major barrier to wildlife including the endangered Canada lynx. Colorado estimates over 4,000 wildlife-vehicle accidents each year, resulting human injuries and fatalities, along with thousands of wildlife deaths.

Dec. 7 Crossings! This is a wonderful opportunity to get a better understanding of the threats of our highway systems to wildlife. Ben Goldfarb is the Colorado author of Eager Beavers, an excellent history of the value of beavers in our ecosystems. His new book is *Crossings: How Road Ecology is Shaping the Future of our Planet*. He will be sharing insights, discussions and a documentary, "Deer 139". 6:00 – 8:30 pm. Thursday, Dec. 7 - Colorado Mountain College, Breckenridge.

December 28, 2023 is the 50th anniversary of the Endangered Species Act (ESA)! The ESA is a testament to the power of partnerships and conservation successes we can achieve by working together. Hundreds of species are stable or improving thanks to conservation actions and partnerships with environmental protection groups and local, state and federal agencies.

TAKE ACTION: SAVE OUR CONFLUENCE!

It's BACK! The Rincon Mine proposal on the banks of the Colorado River near the confluence with the Eagle River will be heard by the Eagle County Board of County Commissioners on Dec. 19, despite receiving two denials for a Special Use Permit by the Planning Commission. Even though Rincon has added some bells, whistles, and scant dollars to the proposal, it's time to stop this ill-conceived project once and for all! Rafters, Anglers, Recreationalists, Wilderness lovers, and people who drink water, unite!

ESWA ADVOCACY EFFORTS

The issues impacting our local Wilderness Areas mount every year. From the Homestake proposal for a new reservoir at the expense of Holy Cross Wilderness acreage, to preserving Bighorn habitat in Vail, to passing the Colorado Outdoor Recreation and Economy (CORE) Act which would protect more than 300,000 Wilderness and public lands throughout the state, demands on our precious wild lands continually increase.

Because of ESWA's strong membership support and volunteerism, we have a small budget to offer occasional donations to 3rd-party causes. In 2023, we donated to Poudre Wilderness Volunteers after their wildfire, to the Town of Vail to protect Bighorn habitat, and to passing the CORE Act, among other initiatives that affect the Holy Cross Wilderness.
